

2024-25 Application Tips

- Familiarize yourself with the program before working on your application. Consider the goals of NSLI-Y and review the <u>website</u> and Terms and Conditions document to better understand what NSLI-Y entails and what it does not.
- **Research** your host languages and locations of interest.
- Think about your **future goals**.
- **Proofread**! It's a good idea to ask an adult to also proofread your work and provide feedback.
- Work on your essays in a word processing program and save your work often.
- Submit your application before November 2! If you have trouble submitting your application or if you encounter a technical problem, you'll have time to resolve the issue with NSLI-Y staff.
- Even after your application has been submitted, you can check to see if your recommender, parent/legal guardian, and school official have submitted their components. Log in to the application and look at the status history boxes in the relevant sections of your application.



The Essays

- <u>Host Family Letter:</u> Answer the questions in the prompt and show your personality. The letter may be shared with your potential future host family.
- <u>Essay 1:</u> Focus on your first language preference. Explain three distinct reasons why you want to participate in NSLI-Y. Consider how NSLI-Y relates to your future interests and remember to consider the NSLI-Y goals.
- <u>Essays 2 and 3</u>: Ensure you are the central figure in your response and that your example is appropriate. Consider what you learned and/or how you grew.

In all of your essays, be honest and authentic! Don't be afraid to let your personality shine through!
