NSLI-Y, FLEX Abroad, and YES Abroad are programs of the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs.		
Program Description	YES Abroad and FLEX Abroad provide merit-based scholarships for American high school students (ages 15-18.5) to study abroad in select countries for an academic year. YES Abroad and FLEX Abroad are cultural exchange programs focused on enhancing Americans' understanding of other countries and cultures through fostering lasting personal ties and engaging youth in activities that advance mutual understanding. Participants live with a host family and enroll in a local high school abroad.	NSLI-Y provides merit-based scholarships to American high school students (ages 15-18) for overseas study of eight critical foreign languages during a summer or academic year. These languages are not commonly taught in U.S. high schools but are critical to America's engagement with the world. NSLI-Y is a language- focused program aimed at developing a cadre of young Americans who will use their language skills to advance international dialogue, compete effectively in the global economy, and promote mutual understanding.
